

b. All Labor Day Rally sponsorships received must be turned in to the ABATE of the Kansas State treasurer to be deposited into the Labor Day Rally accounts & earmarked for appropriate use. (Amended March 2023)

c. All profits from the beverages (excluding beer), will be divided 50% for the district and 50% to the state. The Main stage bar/Wauneta's Bar profits will be split 1/3 to the state, 1/3 to the Mid-South Mile, and 1/3 to the MRF to help pay for the \$1 donation per member (donation amount not to exceed the total number of members). (Amended February 2017)

d. Amber Shutts and Adam Huggins will remain in charge of the state bar "Wauneta's Main Stage Bar & Mobile Beer garden" for as long as they choose to do so. This includes the bar at the Labor Day Rally and the Back To Our Roots Rally. (Amended July 12, 2025)




New business: Tada brought up a gal that she knows that makes shirts and would be interested in doing our products. She can print on demand.

The Referral Service will ensure that attorneys participating in the program support the Mission of A.B.A.T.E. of Kansas, are motorcycle riders who are highly experienced in representing motorcyclists in Kansas, and understand the unique legaland insurance issues surrounding motorcyclists.

All injury claims - motorcycle, car, truck, semi, dangerous product, dangerous premises, etc. - qualify for the service. Additionally, in an effort to make sure that members have adequate insurance, lawyers participating in the referral service will be available to review insurance policies and coverages on members' policies at no cost.

# How Do I Make a Referral?
